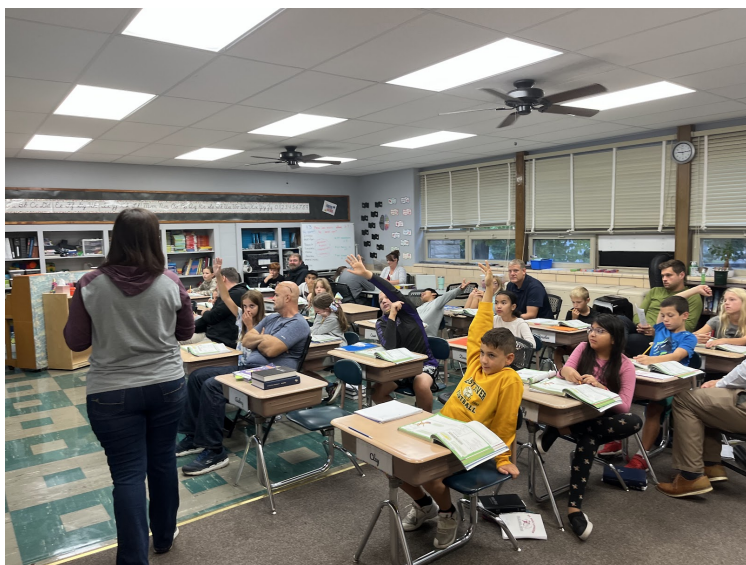
Who to Contact
