Tax season is quickly approaching. A simple form can help deduct up to \$4,000 for K-8 grade tuition and \$10,000 for 9-12 grade tuition on their state income taxes. 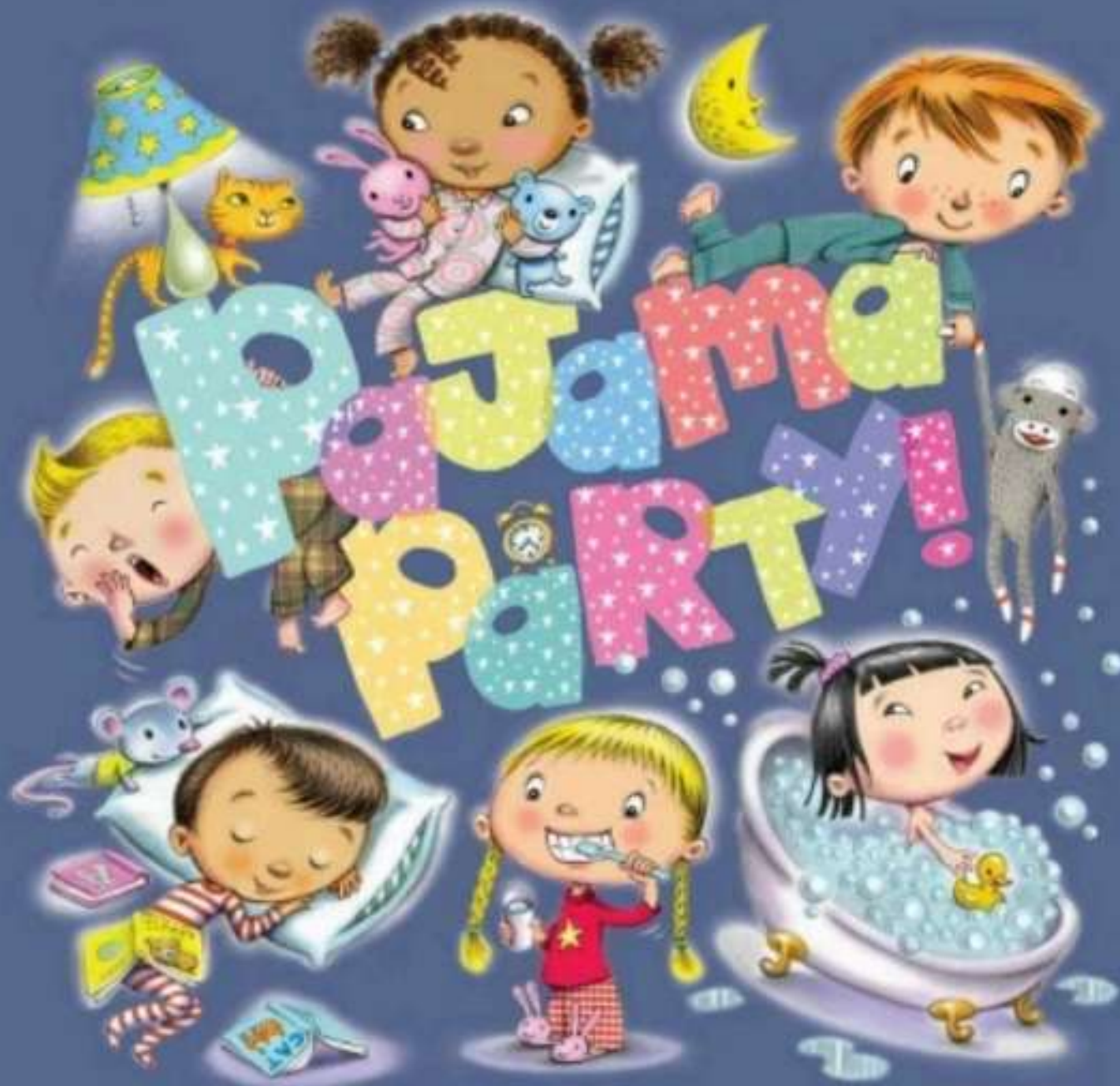

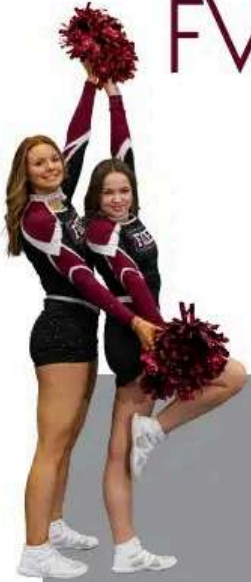
