

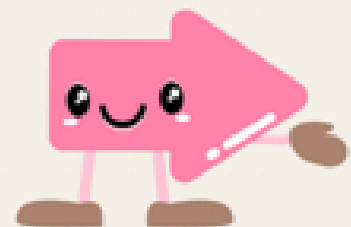
HELP US CELEBRATE STUDENT AIDE APPRECIATION DAY **APRIL 2, 2025**

As Brown County Public Health continues to monitor the growing number of measles cases around the United States, we wanted to send you, as parents/guardians, a letter about how to protect you, your child(ren), and Brown County.

From January 1, 2025, to March 13, 2025, there have been 301 reported measles cases, affecting 12 different jurisdictions (Source: [Measles Cases and Outbreaks | Measles \(Rubeola\) | CDC](#)).

While Wisconsin has no confirmed cases (as of March 14, 2025), many frequently visited Spring Break locations have had confirmed cases. Prevention is key to help prevent measles from making its way to Wisconsin.

The MMR (Measles, Mumps, and Rubella) vaccine is very safe and effective at preventing measles, mumps, and rubella. One dose of MMR vaccine is 93% effective against measles, 72% effective against mumps, 97% effective against rubella. Two doses of MMR vaccine are 97% effective against measles and 86% effective against mumps. Vaccines, like any medicine, can have side effects. These are usually mild and go away on their own. There is no link between the MMR vaccine and autism. Scientists in the United States and other countries have carefully studied the MMR vaccine. No credible study has found a link between autism and the MMR vaccine. Protection starts within 2 weeks of getting the MMR vaccine and if you get the MMR vaccine within 72 hours of initially being exposed to measles, you may get some protection; or have a milder illness.

Brown County Public Health hosts monthly Vaccines for Children (VFC) clinics, including MMR vaccination, for eligible children. Eligible children include those who do not have health insurance, have Badger Care (Medicaid), or are American Indian or Alaska Native. Underinsured people can receive vaccinations at N.E.W. Community Clinic (call 920-437-7206).

The good news is that there is a VFC clinic coming up on Thursday, March 20th with openings so you can get your child up to date on their MMR vaccination. See the link below to sign up for this week's clinic.

Are you or your child(ren) protected against measles? You can check your immunization record through the Wisconsin Immunization Registry:

If you have been exposed to measles and have symptoms, please call your medical provider and stay home! This will reduce the spread of measles, a virus that spreads quickly from person to person and can linger in the air for 2 hours. When infectious with the measles, a simple stop at a store could share it with nine out of 10 others in just a short time.

What are the symptoms?

High Fever (may spike to more than 104° F)

Cough

Runny Nose

Red, Watery Eyes

Rash that appears 3-5 days after first symptoms. Usually, it begins as flat red spots on the face at the hairline, then spreads downward to the neck, trunk, arms, legs, and feet.

Infectious Period: a person can spread the measles virus 4 days before to 4 days after the **rash** shows up.

If you need medical care, please alert the healthcare facility where you believe you have been exposed to measles and are seeking care for symptoms.

Also, a friendly reminder that DHS has set forth an Exclusion Policy: Per DHS 144.07, (10) If a substantial outbreak as defined in s. DHS 144.02 (21) occurs in a school or child care center or in the municipality in which a school or child care center is located; the school or child care center shall exclude students who have not received all required immunizations against the disease, including students in all grades who have not had two doses of measles vaccine, when it is an outbreak of measles that is occurring when ordered to do so by the department. The exclusion shall last until the student is immunized or until the department determines that the outbreak has subsided. [Wisconsin Legislature: Chapter DHS 144](#)
