Curriculum Updates: We will be implementing a new math resource called enVision Mathematics this school year and you can expect homework to look a little different. You can find a letter from FVL schools with greater detail [here](#). As the letter notes, any change to curriculum or instruction takes time to acclimate to. That being said, this new math curriculum promotes what one staff member referred to as "productive struggle." If you think back to a time when you really learned something, was it easy to learn or was it difficult and novel? I suspect the latter was the case. For learning to "stick," educators and curriculum specialists have discovered that sometimes learners must struggle with the concepts and sometimes even circle back before mastery is achieved. With the enVision Mathematics resources, you will see and hear your students sometimes express frustration at challenging mathematical concepts. Please know that we at St. Paul are here to support them in their effort to become confident mathematicians.

Athletics - Mr. Jammer: Official volleyball and soccer practices start the first day of school, Wednesday, August 24.
