CLASSROOM NEWS

3/4K—Mrs. Nelson—The cold weather is keeping us inside, but we made some pretend snow for our sensory table. We also played snowman matching and memory and made some snowflakes with glue and sequins. We have started to hear how Jesus showed His almighty power by doing miracles. We know that He cares for us!

3/4K—Mrs. Zabell— Jesus did his first miracle changing water into wine. We learned that God can help us with any problem and took care of our worst problem- sin. We grouped the kids by age this week. The 4K kids worked more on writing words and a progressive story, identifying numerals and engineering while the 3K kids worked on 1:1 correspondence, counting, matching letters, building and enjoying books.

5K—Mrs. Jammer— We began our study of letter Uu this week and are doing lots of activities with the 5 vowels aeiou. If you get the chance, take a “field trip” through the fabric department of a store. It will tie in well with our science unit. Notice all the different kinds of cloth, their texture, designs and colors, and their uses. Share pictures if you go. Scholastic book orders are due Monday, Jan. 31. They said their global supply issues are over. Dates to remember: Sing in church Sunday, Feb. 6 at either the 8:00 or 10:30am service. Perform pre show entertainment (bells, boomwhackers, and a routine) on Saturday, March 5 at 6:30pm.

1—Mrs. Blum—We are entering the time of year when first graders encounter more and more new learning and where they learn to tell themselves that they can do it! Each day we remind ourselves that it’s absolutely okay to make mistakes, learn from them and keep persevering. Keep encouraging your child to do their best at school and look for ways to help them learn new things at home, too. Thank you for your support!

2—Mrs. Bakeberg—We are working on “A Race to the Finish” every day now! We are learning lines, songs, how to use expressions in our voices, speak slowly, speak loudly, etc. There are a lot of great things to be learned in preparing a musical! 3— Mrs. Walkley—This week we had another math lesson about recipes and cooking. This would be a great opportunity to let your student help in the kitchen to keep practicing. So far we’ve worked on measuring, setting the temperature, and figuring out what time it will be when the food’s ready. We are also starting to type out the masterpieces that we’ve been working on in writing. Keep working on those states and capitals, and keep reading for the book report! Have a great weekend!

4— Mrs. Krug—The fourth graders have been working hard on writing an informational paper on a non-fiction topic. They have been writing an introduction, three paragraphs and a conclusion. We will be working on editing and writing our final copy this next week. We also will be starting another informational writing that they will research. Ask your student which topic(s) they are looking to research. If they would like to find books at the public library, that is permissible but not necessary. Keep working on math facts, capitals, and don't forget to start reading their book for their next book report.

5 & 6—Mr. Jammer—Our classroom sings at the St. Paul’s Prayer at the Close of Day service on Wednesday, February 2 - 7:30 pm. You were asked to return the singing memo by today. In Christ-Light, we are discussing the history of the Children of Israel as they enter the Promised Land of Canaan.

7 & 8—Mr. Brennan— The end of January is in sight! We have plenty of excitement on the horizon as well. Basketball tournaments, cheer competitions, and even starting to prepare for the school play are all things yet to come. We have plenty to learn and do in class as well. We have just begun reading “Animal Farm” which is a very deep book despite it’s title. Take some time and discuss it with your 7th or 8th grader. 7-8th grade will be making a video presentation for their term project in history.
