CLASSROOM NEWS

3/4K—Mrs. Nelson—Building play doh creations is helping make our fingers stronger for writing. We are becoming more aware of letters and words as we walk through the hallways of school. And we did sensory work with pinecones and little pom poms, making little Christmas trees! David trusted God to help him defeat Goliath. We are learning the words, “In God I trust. I will not be afraid!”

3/4K—Mrs. Zabell— God helped David defeat Goliath. Jesus defeated our worst problem of sin, so we can trust him in all things! Our small group times focused on drawing different kinds of lines, forming letters with straight and curvy wood pieces, working on our writing skills with pencils and paper, and problem solving with cars, ramps and tracks. We are excited to be working on our Christmas recitations and song.

5K—Mrs. Jammer—We are finishing our study of letter Tt with Superkids Tic, Tac, and Toc. In writing class we interviewed a partner to find out what they like to do and then we wrote and drew a picture about it. We are practicing our song and recitations each day for the Christmas service. I sent a copy of them home on Monday. 1—Mrs. Blum—A few reminders as we enter this winter season: Students need to have dry snow gear each day.
