Snow Days and Delays

Recently a parent asked, "Why not just have no school if there's going to be a delay?" This is a great question, and here is my response. *The decision to cancel or delay school is never an easy one for school officials to make. This is usually only done when there is a situation so severe that the physical safety of the staff and students is in jeopardy. In the case of a delay due to weather, the decision is made when the plows and then the buses and parent vehicles may not be able to get to school on time. The reason to have school after a delay comes down to legal requirements over the number of hours. At this time, St. Paul could have 1 1/2 days worth of no school or snow days before we would need to add additional days to the school year or minutes to each day. The decision to keep a child at home, when school is in session, is always up to the parent. If you feel like the weather is such that you will not be able to make it in safely, then you should keep your child at home.*
